Standard Profile Attributes

- First Name / Last Name
- Nickname
- Age (COPPA, ad/content targeting)
- Birthdate (personalization)
- Gender (ad/content targeting)
- Location (ad/content targeting)

Same identifier for all realms

- No Pairwise Pseudeononymous Identifiers (PPIDs)
- Yahoo may run multiple realms, we want to correlate the user across all Yahoo Properties and partner sites

Email address

- The real email address, not a disposable proxied email address
- Identity correlation
 - Identify existing account(s)
 - Help users find and connect with each other
- Need to know whether email is verified, and level of certainty
 - OP is the user's email provider
 - OP verified the user's email in the past
 - issues with recycling

Email normalization

- “.” and +<string> might not be significant

Identifier that the user knows

- Users need to be able to identify their account out of band from the OpenID protocol
 - Customer Support
 - Email address would work if Yahoo required verified email address for a YahooID (we don't)

Abuse/Reputation

- CAPTCHA
- Account Creation Date
- Reputation
